Arlington County provides environmentally safe disposal of your household hazardous materials (HHM) at our biannual E-CARE collection event.

Drop-Off Guidelines:

- Materials should be in original container or labeled.
- Leaking containers should be overpacked and labeled.
- Non-hazardous refuse materials are not accepted.
- ID required to verify Arlington County residency.
- No commercial or business waste is accepted.
- Materials accepted only during posted event hours.
- No smoking at the drop-off site.

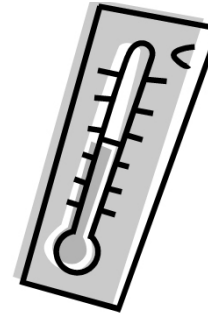
and youth sizes are especially needed, as are rugs and window air conditioning units in good condition.

Bring your computer monitors, electronics and TVs for recycling. There is a \$15 fee for each computer monitor and a \$20 fee for each TV containing cathode ray tubes (CRTs), payable by cash or check made out to Arlington County Treasurer. No credit cards accepted. No charge for other electronics.
