Northern VA Market Trends

The Northern Virginia Association of Realtors® reports on November 2009 home sales activity for Fairfax and Arlington counties, the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax and Falls Church and the towns of Vienna, Herndon and Clifton. Below are some figures:

A total of 1,567 homes sold in 11/09, up 42.45% from 1,100 units in 11/08. Active listings decreased by 27.51% from last year with 6,067 active listings in 11/09 compared with 8,369 homes in 11/08. The average days on market (DOM) for homes in 11/09 45% to 50 days, from 91 days in 11/08.

Sales prices rose slightly compared with those realized last year. The average sales price in 11/09 was \$428,581, up from \$423,088 in 11/08.

Arlington County's average sales price increased from \$483,600 in 11/08 to \$523,000 in 11/09.

Home Buyer Tax Credit

Last November Congress extended the tax credit amending it to include some repeat buyers in hopes of securing a more sustained real estate upswing.

Fueled by the original November 30, 2009 deadline, sales of existing homes had increased steadily since April. A good majority of all closed transactions involved first-time buyers.

The conforming loan limit for Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac is still at \$729,750 through the end of this year.

Neighborhood Conservation Update

The first priority proposed project (unfunded) for the neighborhood is South Irving Street/Arlington Boulevard (Phase II) which would address pedestrian, bicycling, and motorist safety issues on the Arlington Blvd frontage, and beautify the area where possible. This project is in the concept design phase. An informational session was held with county staff on May 24, 2010. All residents were invited, and immediately impacted homeowners were given written invitations to the meeting. Residents provided significant feedback on the concept design. County staff are assessing potential adjustments to the design in response to the feedback. A vote is expected on the concept design at the AHCA summer meeting on July 13. Only if the design is approved will the project qualify to be considered for county funding. *All residents in the neighborhood may vote on Neighborhood Conservation projects. It is not necessary to be a member of the civic association.*

Our two pending funded sidewalk, curb, gutter and streetlight projects continue to move forward. Construction on South Fenwick Street (Arlington Blvd to 2nd Street South) began at the end of May, and is expected to be completed this summer. The schematic design for Irving Street (Access Road to 2nd Street South) is almost complete, and a meeting with homeowners will be scheduled soon to review the project, and proceed with obtaining temporary easements from homeowners. Due to the need to widen the street, Dominion Power will need to move utility poles before construction can commence. It should be noted that the intersection with Arlington Blvd. will not be addressed during this phase of the project. Because Arlington Blvd. is owned by VDOT, the intersection portion of the project will be handled with the Irving Street/Arlington Blvd. (Phase II). Once Phase II is approved by the neighborhood, and funded, designs for the frontage and the intersection will be submitted together for a VDOT permit. Arlington County has received a grant to redesign the Irving/ Arlington Blvd. intersection. The scope of the grant encompasses the north and south sides of the intersection.
