## CAREER CENTER UPDATE

The Arlington Public Schools (APS) School Board passed its 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) on June 21, 2018. The CIP earmarks \$185 million for adding 800 new high-school seats at the Career Center campus. With the addition of the 800 seats, the Career Center site will host approximately 2,120 high school students plus 500 elementary school students on the 12-acre site.

The CIP also includes funds for a field and underground parking, to be built by 2023. The 800 seats are to be added by 2025, along with a performing arts facility. Other instructional facilities found at APS's comprehensive high schools—such as a pool, track, auxiliary gym, practice fields, diamond fields—were not funded in this CIP. At the School Board meeting, the board members would not commit on the instructional focus of the 800 high-school seats (i.e., comprehensive or choice).


The Career Center Working Group (CCWG) will wrap up this August. The CCWG will provide a report to the School Board and the County Board that defines how APS can open the 800 additional seats and offers opinions on the feasibility of building a fourth comprehensive high school at the Career Center site through a phased development plan.

The following phasing plan has been presented to the CCWG and represents a likely but **unofficial** construction plan. Phasing will begin with the addition of a third floor to the Career Center building, together with the construction of a new 3-level building on the west side of the current Career Center building on South Highland St. This construction phase will take approximately 12 to 18 months.


POSSIBLE CONSTRUCTION PHASE 1A




The Career and Technical Education (CTE) program shops will then be relocated to the new building and the existing shops taken down. This construction phase will take approximately two to three months.



Finally, a new building will be constructed along South 9th Street and Walter Reed to house the 800 new high school seats.

# MASTER GARDENERS: WHAT THEY CAN DO FOR YOU

Master Gardeners are trained volunteer educators who work within their local communities to encourage and promote environmentally sound horticulture practices through sustainable landscape management education and training.

So what's the point? Master Gardeners are here to help you. And Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia (MGNV), the Arlington-Alexandria group, does a LOT in that regard.

Our trainees receive about 70 hours of hands-on and classroom education from Cooperative Extension agents and specialists, university faculty, green industry professionals, and Arlington and Alexandria park and recreation administrators.

Newly graduated Master Gardener Interns then complete the remainder of their 120 hours of training working on class projects, demonstration gardens, Horticulture Help Desk, plant clinics, and community special events. After completing these additional training/service hours, Interns become Certified Master Gardeners.

From that point, Master Gardeners have to maintain their certification through continuing education (8 hours per year) and by volunteering for 20 hours at minimum.

We often teach or assist the local Extension Agent with classes on a wide range of topics. Just this month (August), we're offering a class on common pests and diseases of trees; plant diseases and pests in the vegetable garden; and fall and winter vegetable gardening.

We also staff plant clinics at the main Arlington, Old Town Alexandria, and Del Ray Farmers Markets—all on Saturdays—as well as at the main Arlington Library on Wednesday evenings. You can bring us pictures or samples of plants and pests to identify, help you find solutions to gardening problems, and guide you in choosing the best plants for your home landscape.

Our farmers market and library clinics are generally open spring through fall, but all year round you can consult with Master Gardeners at the Horticulture Help Desk at the Extension Office in the Fairlington Community Center, by email at mgarlalex@gmail. com, or by calling 703-228-6414. There's a wealth of information available to help find answers to your questions—and if our experienced Extension Agent and Master Gardeners don't know the answer, they know how to find it!

MGNV also maintains several demonstration gardens in Arlington and Alexandria to let you see real-world examples of the types of plants that grow well in our horticultural zone. Bon-Air Park in Arlington features both a sunny and a shady garden of ornamental

If you visit the gardens you may well encounter the Master Gardeners who maintain them; don't hesitate to ask questions!

In a garden, at a clinic or in a class, Master Gardeners are ready and willing to help however we can. That's what we are here for. It's what we train for. And the more we help to answer your questions, the more we learn ourselves. Everybody wins!
